Title of the Practice: "ENVIRONMENTAL CONSCIOUSNESS"

Objectives of the Practice:

- To promote environmental consciousness among all college members.
- To minimize the environmental impacts of all college operations
- To inculcate environmentally safe behaviour among all college members.

> The Context:

The Climate Changes is causing natural disasters and distresses of unprecedented magnitude and frequency in the World. Moreover, local air, water and food pollutions are also killing. Therefore, we need to essentially practice and promote environmentally safe behaviour. "Saving the Earth is saving Ourselves."

> The Practice:

For achieving the above objectives, we follow "Learning by Doing" principle. Title of the Practice: "UNITY IN CULTURAL DIVERSITY"

Objectives of the Practice:

> The Context:
